

## Testing Information by State

### Kentucky Testing Information

The new testing sites with Kroger will be located in Louisville, Lexington, Owensboro and Bowling Green. **Kroger testing is open to everyone who needs a test.** Those seeking to obtain a test can get location and registration details at [the KrogerHealth website](#).

Testing will be conducted April 27 to May 1 from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. at Louisville's Shawnee Park, 4501 W. Broadway; and at Lexington's Bluegrass Community and Technical College, 500 Newtown Pike.

The testing also will be done April 28 to April 30 from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. at Owensboro Community College, 4800 New Hartford Road; and at Bowling Green's South Warren High School, 8140 Nashville Road.

Through a separate partnership with Walgreens, the company will offer a drive-through testing option in Lexington, starting Friday and is **open to everyone who needs a test.** The location is 2296 Executive Drive. The site is open seven days a week, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. ET. Visit [walgreens.com/coronavirus](https://www.walgreens.com/coronavirus) for additional information on registering.

### Indiana Testing Information

If you think you have been exposed to COVID-19 and develop a fever and symptoms, such as cough or difficulty breathing, call your healthcare provider for medical advice. You can also consult a healthcare provider through telehealth if that is an option. The healthcare provider will determine if you will be referred for testing.

The Indiana State Department of Health is conducting drive-thru clinics at areas in need throughout the state. To increase our testing of Hoosiers who are sick we are expanding who can be tested at our drive-thru clinics to include healthcare workers, first responders, or essential workers and someone in your household is symptomatic. If you are not a healthcare worker, first responder, or **essential worker** but you are at higher risk due to your age, weight, or underlying health conditions and are symptomatic, you also can visit a drive-thru clinic for testing. One test per vehicle, Indiana residents only.

VOA Mid-States employees are defined as **essential workers** by the Governor of Indiana due to caring for individuals with developmental disabilities.

### Tennessee Testing Information

Tennessee is providing the opportunity to get tested for the coronavirus even if you are **not** showing symptoms. The Tennessee Department of Health is setting up free drive-thru test sites on April 25 and April 26 at various sites across the state. Anyone with health concerns, or who has concerns about the health of a family member, is invited to go get tested.
